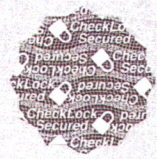

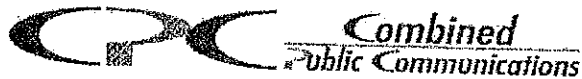

**Combined Public Communications  
Inmate Telecommunications General Service Agreement**

This General Service Agreement, is entered into by and between the Board of County Commissioners of Butler County, Ohio, 315 High Street, Hamilton, Ohio 45011, hereinafter referred to as "County" and Combined Public Communications, whose business address is 100 Aqua drive, Cold Spring, Kentucky 41076 herein referred to as "Contractor".

**Exclusive Agreement:**

County agrees to exclusively permit Contractor to install the Inmate Telecommunications System (ITS) that will process pre-paid calls including local and long distance traffic and associated hardware and software within all pre-existing and future jail and/or detention facilities.

**Contractor Equipment:**

The ITS and all associated equipment installed under this agreement will remain the sole and exclusive property of Contractor, County will promptly report to Contractor misuse, destruction, or vandalism of the system or telephones. County will not use the ITS for business purposes nor list or advertise in any manner the telephone numbers of the ITS without the prior written consent of Contractor.

**County Access to Equipment and Reports:**

Contractor will give County access to the ITS that is password protected, allowing County's staff to monitor / record calls and run call detail reports. Call detail reports will be stored off site at a secure Contractor location. Contractor technicians will train County's authorized staff on the usage of the system.

**Service Agreement:**

All service and maintenance of the ITS will be the sole responsibility of Contractor. Service level information located on page five (5).

**KIOSK and/or Vending Machine:**

The KIOSK or vending machine location(s) will be agreed upon by the County and Contractor and remain operable and on site throughout the term of the Agreement. Contractor technicians will service, stock and maintain the machine(s).

**Contractor Employees**

Contractor will only employ United States citizens or legal residents of the U.S. to install, maintain and service the ITS and all associated equipment located at the Butler County Adult Detention facilities in Hamilton, Ohio.

**Insurance**

Contractor will maintain throughout the term of the general service agreement the following insurance requirements:

- A) Workers Compensation insurance in accordance with the laws of the State of Ohio for all personnel and covering all sites subject to this service agreement.
- B) Certificate of Insurance covering Public Liability and Auto Liability Insurance in the amount not less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence and aggregate for bodily injury, including accidental death, to any one person and in an amount not less than \$2,000,000 on account of any one occurrence and aggregate.

Such insurance shall remain in full force and effect during the life of the general service agreement. Insurance may not be changed or canceled unless the insured and the Board of County Commissioners are notified in writing not less than ten days prior to such change or cancellation. If any part of the general service agreement is sublet, the Contractor is responsible for that part being adequately covered by the insurance hereir described above.

**Agreement Term:**

This General Service Agreement shall be governed in accordance with the laws of the State of Ohio and remain in full force and effective for a period of two (2) years, with one (1) year renewal options exercisable at County's discretion.

**Commission:**

Butler County will receive fifty three percent (53%) commission on all prepaid talk time revenue generated from prepaid calling cards and fifty five percent (55%) commission on all revenue generated from direct pay and pin debit calling.

**Additional Products Include:**

- 1) The Investigative tool box which includes –
  - Voice print technology- continuous voice identification; can be extracted from any source
  - Covert Enrollment- Voice print created without inmate's knowledge, no enrollment required.
  - Speaker identification- compare the speaker to a watch list in real time
  - Identifies inmates vs. the public
  - Supports all languages
  - Identify pin sharing
  - Show Call Patterns- visual link analysis shows the relationships between inmates and called parties
  - Best Known Name/ Address (BKNA) shows information in visual link analysis
  -
- 2) The Vision Video Visitation solution will expand to Resolutions on Second Street and the Court Street Facility.  
The visitor terminals will be located in the Main Jail lobby on Hanover Street for all three (3) locations.  
Court Street - Contractor will replace the ten (10) current inmate video visitation stations with ten (10) Vision Video Visitation Units.  
Resolutions on Second Street - Contractor will modify the current glass window visitation booths to allow for the installation of ten (10) Vision Video Visitation Units.
- 3) Contractor will pay up to twenty five thousand dollars (\$25,000) per year for an off duty deputy to oversee weekend visitation.
- 4) Contractor will continue to support the video arraignment system at the Hamilton, Cincinnati, and Columbus locations.

**Courtesy Calling Cards:**

As a courtesy, if requested, Contractor will provide monthly, complementary calling cards that permit local and long distance calling within the United States. The number of complementary calling cards will be allocated monthly and based upon the average number of bookings per month; the complementary calling cards may be adjusted at Contractor's discretion, depending upon the jail's needs.

**Taxes, Regulatory & Network Fees:**

Taxes, regulatory and service fees are deducted at the point of sale; network connection costs are deducted from the total revenue; these costs are not included in commission.

**Calling Rates:**

Contractor will charge telephone rates allowed by tariff, if applicable. The rates may be amended by Contractor and the County.  
Call rates located on page five (5).

**Liability:**

Contractor will have no liability for damage to County's premises from the installation, use or removal of the ITS or associated equipment unless such damage is the result of negligence of Contractor's agents or employees.

**Indemnification**

As further consideration for this agreement for installation of inmate telephones in the Butler County Jail, the Contractor, hereby agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Sheriff of Butler County, the board of County Commissioners of Butler County and the Butler County Jail in any and all claims arising by reason of allegations of excessive charges in violation of any state or federal statute or regulatory ruling. In the event of future legislation or administrative regulation materially alters the charges which may be made by Contractor, then and in the event that Contractor agrees to abide by any such statute or ruling and bring their conduct of charges into compliance with said authority. In the event that any future legislation or administrative regulation materially alters the terms of this agreement, then and in that event, said agreement shall at the option of either party be subject to re-negotiation between the parties.

**Regulatory Changes:**

In the event that new and/or revised government regulations prevent Contractor from providing commission or services to the County, Contractor will have the right to renegotiate this Agreement with the County.

**Uncontrollable Circumstances:**

Contractor reserves the right to renegotiate this Agreement if circumstances arise outside our control related to acts of God, change in call rates, regulations, operations mandated by law, reduction in inmate population or capacity, material changes in jail policy or economic conditions.

**Maintenance and Repair**

Contractor may remove or replace the ITS or associated equipment from any given location when damage to the system or associated equipment, whether by vandalism or otherwise, warrants removal. Contractor, with the consent of County, may adjust the number of inmate telephones at the premise when in Contractor's judgment the revenue generated by the existing inmate telephones warrants such adjustments.

**Termination**

Either party may terminate this Agreement in the event that the other party materially fails to perform its obligations under this Agreement and said material failure shall continue for a period of thirty (30) days after written notice to the defaulting party of said failure is given. In the event any governmental tariff or regulation prevents Contractor from providing services or such tariffs or regulations make continuation of this agreement impractical for economic reasons or otherwise, then Contractor at its sole discretion may terminate this Agreement without liability. In the event of a termination of this Agreement for any reason, the County agrees to allow Contractor access to the facility in order to remove all equipment, including but not limited to inmate telephones and all associated equipment. Contractor agrees to remove the equipment within thirty days after termination of this Agreement.

**Resolution of Disputes**

Any and all disputes arising under this agreement shall be brought in a court of appropriate venue and competent jurisdiction.

**Authority to Represent**

Each party to this Agreement warrants and represents that they have the unrestricted right and prerequisite authority to enter into and execute this Agreement, to bind the respective party, and to authorize the installation and operation of the equipment.

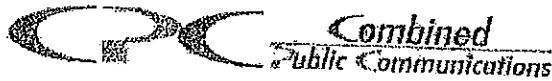

Response time:

An individual phone outage:	24 hours
Section of the building outage:	4 hours
Complete system wide outage:	2 hours

A routine service failure with no impact on the administrative functions of the system such as an individual phone outage, repair time is 24 hours.



Furthermore, signing this document confirms to Contractor that the detention facility described herein is not under a contract with any other inmate telephone provider. The undersigned has the authority and hereby directs Contractor to install their inmate telephone system.

The rights and obligations of this Agreement will be binding and shall inure to the benefit of the respective parties, their subsequent owners, successors, heirs, and assignees.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto intending to be legally bound, have executed this Agreement to be effective beginning on the 30th day of April, 2018 (the Commencement date). Any and all previous contracts and agreements entered into between these parties are null and void.
