

Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) Nurse

JOB SUMMARY: The Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) Nurse provides direct nursing care and services to incarcerated patients with opioid use disorder and other substance use disorders. The role includes screening and triage, clinical assessment, initiation and maintenance of MAT under standing orders or provider directives, medication administration and reconciliation, patient education, and care coordination. The position operates within a correctional setting and requires strict adherence to safety, security, confidentiality, and medication diversion-prevention protocols. Position reports to Lieutenant of the Medical Division.

Job duties include but are not limited to:

- Conduct medical intake screenings, collect vitals and health histories, assess withdrawal symptoms (COWS/CIWA-Ar), and document findings accurately.
- Administer and monitor MAT medications (e.g., buprenorphine, naltrexone) in accordance with provider orders, clinical protocols, and security procedures.
- Maintain secure medication storage, perform reconciliations and documentation, and report discrepancies or safety concerns.
- Collaborate with physicians, behavioral health, and custody staff to support patient care, emergency response, and discharge planning, ensuring compliance with all policies and procedures.

Training in Medication-Assisted Treatment protocols required.

Possess a valid State Driver license.

Legally able to work in the United States.

Never been convicted of a felony offense and be able to complete a comprehensive background investigation.
